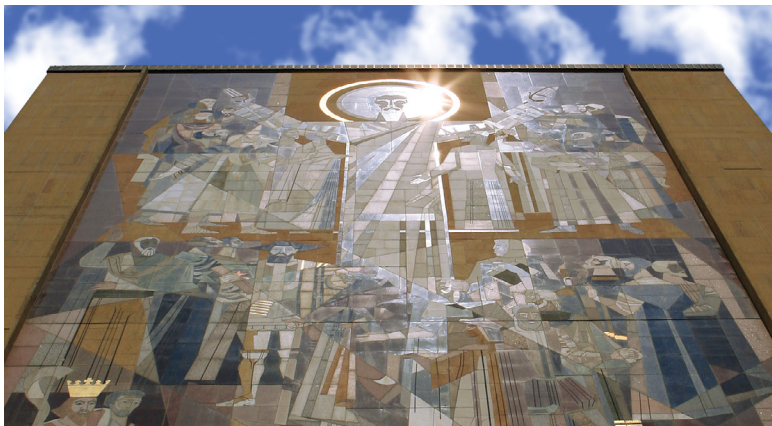




The Hesburgh Libraries is the name of the system of libraries on Notre Dame's campus (except the Law School's Kresge Law Library, which is independent in support of the school's accreditation needs). Hesburgh Library is our flagship library building—it features the famous Word of Life mosaic on the front and overlooks the reflecting pool and football stadium to the south. The Hesburgh Library offers collections and services for all members of the Notre Dame community and is home to several specialty centers and libraries, including: the Center for Digital Scholarship, the Medieval Institute Library, Rare Books and Special Collections, and University Archives.

In addition to the Hesburgh Library, there are eight branch library locations: Architecture Library, Chemistry-Physics Library, Engineering Library, Kellogg Kroc Library, Mahaffey Business Library, O'Meara Mathematics Library, Radiation Chemistry Reading Room, and the Visual Resources Center. You can learn more about the locations, collections, services and expertise across campus using this checklist. Completing these activities will familiarize you with our libraries and support success in your research and writing here at the University of Notre Dame.
